Frietsch and Biedinger had obtained from the Lincoln National bank the money for the payrolls of both the Sixth street store of the Wocher company and the warehouse, amounting in all to \$2,700. They went from the bank direct to the store where the payrolls were sorted out, money for the warehouse being placed in a box in 51 envelopes.

SAY SOLDIERS WILL PATROL ENTIRE CITY

Colonel Denhardt Expects to Ferret Out Gunmen.

Announcing in a statement he made to The Times-Star that the entire city of Newport would be patroled by State troops under his command. Col. II. II. Denhardt added: "We understand that a lot of gunmen. crooks and I. W. W. agitators are in this city. We intend to make a systematic search for this class of men and see that they are brought to justice. We mean business." Under the plan of patroling the




