GENERAL NEWS.
The London newspapers referring to the result of the match in Melbourne between Lord Sheffield's team and the Australian eleven, comment in generous terms upon the play of the Englishmen. The opinion is generally expressed that the team is the strongest that has visited Australia, and that if Sheffield, Gunn and O'Brien were included it would represent the full strength of England.

The new steamer built to the order of Messrs. Huddart Parker and Co. for the New Zealand trade will be named the Warrimoon, and the former will be launched in February, and starts on a trip to Norway in July or August.
